Christmas season in Anaconda starts with Stroll Night

Introducing the Festival of Trees

Anaconda has a distinct charm that can only be found in a small town, and during the Christmas season the city comes alive with lighted garlands adorning the streetlights, scattered decorated Christmas trees throughout downtown businesses, and of course, the magnificent Kennedy Common tree.

And the event that, per tradition, kicks off the holiday season is the iconic lighting of the aforementioned tree during the annual Anaconda Christmas Stroll on Friday, Nov. 29.

If you're unfamiliar with the event, the tree lighting isn't exactly the beginning of the festivities, that would be the Parade of Lights. The illuminated floats, cars, and even bikes dazzle their way from the courthouse down Main Street. Lineup begins at

the courthouse at 5 p.m., with the parade to start at 5:30 p.m.

Then, what is arguably the highlight of the magical night is the Tree Lighting Ceremony at 6 p.m.

During the ceremony, the announcer will draw numbers for the Stroll button drawing. Don't get discouraged if your number isn't drawn. No, you're likely not on the naughty list and there will be more opportunities to win during the shopping event taking place downtown after the tree lighting. Without making any promises, Santa Claus has been known to show up as well.

During the Stroll, many downtown stores open their doors after hours allowing eager "strollers" an opportunity to win additional button drawings and get a head start on their holiday shopping including various sales and discounts.

There will be live mannequins on display, long a

popular part of Stroll Night.

And Christmas Strollers in Anaconda will have a new fun treat for Stroll Night, as Discover Anaconda is introducing a Festival of Trees, with organizations, businesses and individuals decorating and donating trees – 10 in all – to go up for auction.

The trees will be on display at the Elks Lodge starting at 5 p.m. on the day of the Stroll, Nov. 29, with a reception at 8 p.m., then the bids will be pulled at 8:30 p.m. The proceeds will go to Discover Anaconda – or, in the case of trees donated by nonprofits, the proceeds of those will be divided 50/50.

Finally, photos and cookie decorating with Santa will be available at Hickory House Inn to solidify the memories for many years to come.

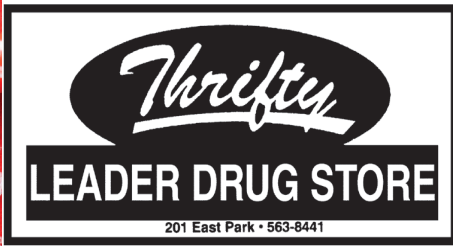

Toys for Tots to hold Toy and Food Drive on Dec. 6 at Albertson's

The Toys for Tots operation in Anaconda is underway, and the annual collection of toys for many girls and boys in the Smelter City is set to have its biggest event of the year Friday, Dec. 6 from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. at Albertson's Supermarket at 1300 E. Park Ave.

That's where the Marine Corps League "Private Mike" Detachment 1380 will be partnering with Albertson's to collect toys as well as donations for the Project Care Food Bank in Anaconda. Customers at the checkout stand will have the opportunity to donate a new, unwrapped toy, and if they do so they will be provided

with a bag of food that they may either choose to keep or may donate to the food bank.

Also, Stoke's Market is collecting for Toys for Tots through the first part of December.

Toys for Tots, a program run by the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve for the past 75 years, is seeking donations of new, unwrapped toys.

While in the past, families looking to sign up for Toys for Tots would have to do so with paper applications, that's no longer how it's done. Applications instead are processed on the website Anaconda-MT.ToysForTots.org. There also are Toys for Tots posters around town

that have both the name of the website and the QR Code that people can scan with their phones to take them to the site. The cut-off date to register is Dec. 18. Toy distribution day is Dec. 21.

Christmas tree cutting permits available through the Forest Service

Coming back to Recreation.gov this holiday season, you'll be able to purchase a permit to cut down a Christmas Tree on the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest. Cutting down your own tree is the perfect way to create a memorable holiday experience, share a special tradition with family and friends, and help maintain a healthy forest.

Christmas Tree Permits will be available for purchase through Recreation.gov. Sales dates for permits may vary by individual forests, so be sure to check with your local forest for location-specific information.

Where to Cut Your Tree
Your permit allows you to cut Christmas trees on the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest.

Make sure you cut your tree on public lands by checking either the Southwest Montana Interagency Visitor Map or the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest Visitors Map and follow road signs.

Do not cut on private land, in wilderness areas, designated recreation sites, previously thinned areas, or existing tree plantations.

Do not cut in active timber sales or areas that have been

planted with new trees.

Do not cut trees visible from major roads, within 150-foot of streams and creeks, or in other well-used areas.

Please post your permit on your dash.

Selecting Your Tree

Each forest has limitations on the size of the tree you can cut and the species of trees that are permitted. See below to help you measure and choose a tree that meets your permit's guidelines.

Prohibited Tree Species:
Whitebark Pine or White Pine (5-Needle Pine).

Tree Height: 12 feet maximum; **Stump height:** 6 inches maximum.

Take the whole tree. Cutting the tree top off is prohibited.

If snow is on the ground, remove it from around the stump so you can accurately measure the stump and tree height.

Cut the leftover branches from the stump and scatter them.

Planning Your Trip

How to Plan Your Trip

Before you leave home, be sure to measure the space where you plan to place the tree in your home (height and width), and measure the space in your vehicle where you will be transporting the tree.

Cell service may be spotty or unavailable. Be sure someone knows where you are and when to expect you back.

Check the latest weather conditions, forest warnings and road closures before you leave on your trip.

Bring a map with you. Don't rely on GPS because it may not be up-to-date with forest service roads.

Dress warmly and take extra dry clothes. Expect winter weather, including cold temperatures, snow and wind.

Roads may not be plowed. Carry tire chains, shovel(s) and a tow chain. Be sure your vehicle has a full tank of gas. Bring a spare key and give it to someone else in your party. Don't get locked out of your car.

Park in areas so that traffic can get by safely, and do not block gates.

Bring plenty of food and water with you as well as an overnight survival kit in case you become stranded.

Start your day early. Be sure to find your tree and leave the woods before dark.

Helpful Cutting Tips

Carry your tree carefully out of the woods. Dragging the tree will rub off needles and bark.

If the tree is too big to transport inside of your vehicle, wrap it in canvas to prevent wind damage.

Once home, cut the bottom of the trunk off and place the freshly cut trunk in a bucket of water. Replenish water.

If storing your tree outside for a few days before putting it in the house, keep it in an area protected from the wind, such as the north or east side of your house or under a shaded tree.

Tools you might want to consider bringing with you include a measuring tape to ensure you select a tree that fits in your home; handsaw to cut your tree; gloves to protect your hands; boots to protect your feet; a tarp to sit on and/or to

move your tree once it's cut; and rope or straps to secure your tree to your vehicle.

Choose a tree from a dense forested area, which will give

the remaining trees more space to grow.

Gifts with a Lift Program spreads holiday cheer to MSH patients

The Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS) announced today that donation boxes have been set up at various locations across the state to receive holiday gifts to benefit Montana State Hospital (MSH) patients.

The effort is part of the annual Gifts with a Lift program that has played an instrumental role in spreading holiday cheer to patients for the past 72 years. The program ensures all MSH patients receive a gift this holiday season.

MSH Gifts with a Lift coordinator Derek O'Brien said

the program is very important to patients.

"This annual tradition helps brighten the holiday season for patients who are away from family, friends and their communities," O'Brien said. "Gifts with a Lift relies exclusively on the generous donations from Montanans who have historically supported this program for decades, and we're excited to continue this effort."

The program is jointly coordinated by the National Alliance for Mental Illness-MT and DPHHS.

Ideas for gift suggestions

include but are not limited to the following: pocket games/ composition books, socks, t-shirts/sweatshirts, winter wear (hats, gloves, jackets), slippers, blankets/ throws, handheld AM/FM radios, and stationery. MSH is especially in need of winter coats for men and women in sizes M - 3X. (Larger sizes preferred; hoodies and items with strings will not be accepted.)

Individuals or service organizations interested in "adopting" a patient are encouraged to contact O'Brien at (406) 693-7137.

Gifts mailed to the hospital

should not be wrapped; however, donations of wrapping paper and gift boxes are welcome.

"Also, to properly acknowledge our generous program donors, please be sure to include a return receipt, if mailed, as well as your name and address along with the gift," O'Brien said.

Gifts or cash donations can be mailed to Gifts with a Lift, c/o Derek O'Brien, PO Box 300, Montana State Hospital, Warm Springs, MT 59756. Please drop gifts off at participating community drop sites by Dec. 6 or at MSH by Dec. 11. If you wish to mail gifts or donations, please make sure they are postmarked by Dec. 6 to ensure they arrive on time. Please make checks payable to: Gifts with a Lift.

MSH is the only publicly operated inpatient psychiatric hospital in the state. It provides treatment to adults who have serious mental illnesses and who are referred from hospitals, mental health programs, and district courts from across the state.
